A Summer spent visiting a city on both coasts

Bring your own meals aboard domestic flights
because most airlines charge for meals. I didn't
buy the \$5 sack meals and ate at the airport
instead. The prices were high but at least you
got more selection in the airport between
connecting flights. The United flight was very
comfortable. The Hawaii group had a great time
visiting Washington D.C.

I had a week and a half of recovery upon my
return to the islands. Then, it was off to
Vancouver British Columbia for some personal time
away from it all. I flew on Harmony airlines
which was a direct flight from Honolulu. Harmony
had that international quality service that
included good meals but not quite matching the
standard meals found on Japan Airlines. The extra
legroom was generous so it was a very comfortable
flight.

I decided to stay at the University of
British Columbia dormitories instead of an
expensive downtown hotel. You have to deal with
washrooms down the hall and taking the bus into
town but you save a lot of money going this route
that made up for the high Summer airfare I was
paying. Walking became a daily recreational sport
because you have to walk across campus to get to
the bus stop. It was the same at the University
of Maryland so I was used to the walking routine.

The food is great in Vancouver. Many dining
options at all price levels so you are not stuck
with the usual fast food places. Fresh foods was
the norm everywhere I went. It was reasonably
priced at most restaurants. The Chinese food is
much better than what you find in Honolulu about
as good as the Chinese food found in Hong Kong.
